Issues We Tackle

Our vision is to grow an ecosystem of environmental organisations in Greater Christchurch with sufficient capacity to pursue their missions. We've identified these key obstacles and opportunities within the sector:

Organisational disconnection & isolation

"Not having access to support can have a detrimental impact on those who need to make decisions" - Business Mentors New Zealand

Christchurch Envirohub addresses the need for inter-sector connection through free access to venues and networking opportunities. In practical and tangible ways, we enable people in the sector to support each other.

Duplication & lack of coordinated mahi in the sector

We're strengthening the environment sector ecosystem by fostering intra-sector communication and skill sharing. Our electronic tools and in-person events create greater understanding, cooperation, and appreciation of the mahi of hundreds of participating organisations in Greater Christchurch.

We provide resources, information, training and support to enhance organisational productivity and upskill personnel. Our digital map and directory and our ollaborative events also allow potential volunteers and supporters to readily connect with environmental groups.

Tamariki and adults of all ages are learning from, and becoming inspired by, our educational activities. These programmes include weekly Envirokids interactive sessions, school-based Te Tuna Tāone with a focus on urban freshwater, and our Stormwater Superhero Trailer community resource, all of which help to develop collective knowledge and effect positive behavioural change.

Our education programmes, epic storytelling (in e-news and online formats) and continually expanding online Digital Map and Directory provides pathways for all ages to be involved with, and contribute to, the sector.

Our Solutions

Support

- Digital and in-person resources that assist 300+ participating environment groups.
- Centralised marketing and information-sharing services for participating organisations, such as a monthly e-newsletter, social media coverage and monthly eco events calendar.
- Training workshops (on topics of interest such as funding and submission writing) and one-on-one casual couch korero sessions.

Project Costs

Stormwater Superhero Trailer

School event \$1,600 per event
Public event \$1,925 per event
Commercial location \$2,490 per event

Help us deliver stormwater education trailer to a range of public, school and commercial events. Using interative games and entertainment our facilitators engage the community, teaching people the importance of stormwater care and pollution prevention.

Submission Writing Workshops

Sponsor the project \$4,970 per year
Full event cost (incl wages) \$830 per event
Catering only \$150 per event

We collaborate with government agencies to teach local citizens to be more informed and involved in the development of policies that impact their communities. We run practical workshops that connect people with experts who can help them understand the issues and how to make a submission for consultation.

Envirokids

Sponsor the project \$26,500 per year
Full event cost (incl wages) \$510 per event
Materials only \$50 per event

Envirokids connects tamariki through nature through free and interactive activities. Every Saturday, we collaborate with a local environmental organisation to teach kids aged 5-13 about a sustainability-themed topic, inspiring the next generation of kaitiaki.

Sub-Sector Strategy Events

Sponsor the project \$4,920 per year
Full event cost (incl wages) \$820 per event
Catering only \$150 per event

We host events that bring together groups working in the same sub-sectors (e.g. community gardens, waste minimisation, waterway care, etc.) This encourages intra-sector collaboration by enabling environmental groups to share ideas, experiences, and resources.

Environmental Network Gathering

Sponsor the project \$2,300 per year Full event cost (incl wages) \$1,150 per event Catering only \$300 per event

Twice a year, we host a gathering for Christchurch's environmental network to come together and celebrate our collective achievements. Representatives from diverse organisations share their successes and insights, fostering a strong sense of shared accomplishment. These gatherings also serve as an opportunity to reflect on key steps for the future of our organisations and projects.

Oral History Project

Sponsor the project \$12,000 per year Sponsor an individual \$2,400 per person

This project builds on a 2020 series of interviews of Cantabrians who over many years have promoted environmental awareness and action. Priorities around freshwater management and indigenous biodiversity reflect much of what these unsung champions have worked for. Capturing the stories and knowledge of our community leaders and movements will ensure their legacy lives on to inform and inspire present and future generations advocating for nature.

Te Tuna Tāone

Sponsor a school \$8,200 per school (\$7,600 of in-kind time is contributed for each school sponsored)

Te Tuna Tāone Is a year-long action learning programme that works with schools in Ōtautahi Christchurch to empower tamariki to become kaitiaki and take action for urban waterways to improve the life of the taonga species, the longfin tuna (eel). The facilitator gives an introduction to tuna and its habitat, then an awa field day and follow-up sessions throughout the year to develop and realise ākonga/student actions to help the tuna and waterways.

Systems and Administration Workshops

Sponsor the project \$2,400 per year
Full event cost (incl wages) \$600 per event
Catering only \$150 per event

These workshops are tailored to strengthen the abilities of those working in the not-for-profit sector. Topics covered can include marketing & social media, funding application writing, policy creation, strategic planning and general administrative & accounting processes.

Environmental Coworking Space

Sponsor the space \$24,000 per year Sponsor a coworker \$3,960pp per year

Our affordable coworking space addresses issues of disconnection, isolation and resource deficiencies in the non-profit sector. The space provides a vibrant and collaborative workspace and includes access to meeting rooms, electric standing desks (permanent and hotdesk arrangements), secure storage, and social office events.

Rent is calculated on a pay scale arrangement to accommodate for those on tight budgets and working minimal hours.

Green Drinks

Sponsor the project \$7,200 per year
Full event cost (incl wages) \$600 per event
Catering only \$100 per event

Our monthly networking event promotes education, collaboration and connection within the city's environmental sector. Each month, we welcome an expert in the sustainability space to share their experience and expertise. Their talk is then followed by an opportunity for networking and and social connection.

Map, Directory and Calendars

Yearly maintenance and upkeep

\$6,500 per year

Our online map and directory showcase all the sustainable and environmental organisations in Christchurch, making it easier for organisations to find each other, encouraging connection and collaboration.

The eco events calendar showcases all the environment-themed events occuring in Christchurch and the eco funding calendar shows all funding opportunities relevant to those groups.

We conduct Informal interviews with the organisations in our network to build relationships, share the groups' stories and support the passion of the people behind them. The interviews are then transformed into a written article used to capture public interest and showcase the organisation's work through a new lens.
